



 - Cross-fertilisation Annual workshop


Political Dimension

ENP & Environment & Water

Overall goal for environmental cooperation with the neighbourhood: Gradual convergence with EU environment policy and standards

Technical basis for CONVERGENCE of LEGISLATION in the field of WATER (e.g. Morocco: groundwater, Tunisia: saline intrusion; etc.)

⇒ Water Section in Action Plans (Israel, Jordan, Palestinian. Auth., Tunisia, Morocco)



WATER SECTION in AA

Environmental governance:

- Work towards improvements in the overall water and sanitation management system (PAL)
- Pursue efforts to set up administrative structures in charge of water management at national an local levels and improve coordination between different ministries in charge of water resources management (MOR)
- Strengthen administrative capacity of authorities in charge of water resources management (MOR)
- Pursue efforts to improve water supply and quality, in rural areas, with a view to meeting WHO standards (PAL)



- Prevention of deterioration of the environment:
 - Prevent pollution of waters, in particular through enhanced water pollutant emission reporting, drawing on the experiences within the WFD (ISR)
 - Enhance cooperation between relevant authorities on prevention of pollution of water resources (ISR)
 - Exchange of information between on best practices on water reuse (ISR)
 - Adopt a financial strategy for water management issues (MOR)
 - Implement the National water resources plan (TUN)





Enhancing international and regional cooperation:

 Identify possibilities for enhanced regional cooperation, in particular in relation to water issues (JOR, TUN, MOR, PAL)

Financial support & Human resources

- Role of leaders: MS / JRC
- Mobilisation of partners, expertise: EC, MS
- Role of key actors: EMWIS, MENBO, WWF,...
- Complementary resources:
 - o RTD projects (FP6, ARIDE, AQUASTRESS, ...)
 - MEDA regional projects (Irrigation, Water Scarcity...)





WFD - KEY PRINCIPLES

- Protecting all waters, surface and ground waters
- Covering all impacts on waters
- Good quality ('good status') to be achieved, as a rule, by 2015
- Water quality defined in terms of biology, chemistry and morphology
- The challenge of river basin approach
- Cost Recovery and Equitable Charging
- Public Participation
- Integrated Management

Implementation: EUWI a continuous & transparent process

Formal transposition into national law	Dec 2003
Environmental analysis, economic analysis	Dec 2004
Monitoring programmes operational	Dec 2006
Public participation at the latest	Dec 2006
Draft river basin management plans	Dec 2008
Final river basin management plans	Dec 2009
Implementation, assessment, adjustment-	2015 and further



WFD - Common Implementation Strategy



- Need for a common understanding
- Involvement of 25 EU Member States and also candidate countries – stakeholders
- Active Working groups (Ecological status, groundwater, priority substances...)
- Guidance documents
- Pilot River Basins
